Company Background

Alberta Health Services has more than 104,000 dedicated health professionals, support staff, more than 17,600 volunteers and 8,400 physicians who promote wellness and provide health care every day to approximately 3.9 million Albertans. Programs and services are offered at over 450 facilities throughout the province, including hospitals, clinics, continuing care facilities, mental health facilities and community health sites.

Types & Nature of Work

Alberta Health Services offers a variety of shifts including casual, full-time, part-time, evenings, weekends and weekdays.

Registered Nurse:

- provide a wide variety of nursing services
- observe, assess, monitor and document patient symptoms, reactions and progress
- administer medications and injections, assist physicians during procedures and provide education and information to patients, families and caregivers
- use critical thinking, problem solving and decision making skills to provide compassionate and safe patient care
- teach, counsel and advocate on behalf of their patients and take necessary steps to ensure their safety and well-being

Power Engineer:

- must work on a variety of equipment and machinery including generators, boilers, compressors and refrigeration units
- ensure that industrial systems in our health care facilities are operating efficiently and safely and are maintained in accordance with prescribed standard
- ensure the environment is safe and comfortable for patients, clients, health care professionals and visitors

Licensed Practical Nurse:

- contribute to the assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation of patient care
- contribute to many types of patient care, including prevention, acute treatment and management, long term and palliative care
- take and record vital signs, collect various samples, dress wounds, monitor progress and report reactions to treatment, as well as educate patients and families
- advocate for patient needs and take appropriate action to ensure the safety and well-being of those in their care
- work collaboratively with patients, families and the health care team to provide high-quality treatment and care

Health Care Aide:

- provide personal assistance and support services for elderly, disabled, acute or chronically ill people who require short-term assistance or ongoing support
- work with patients who have chronic and/or complex medical conditions, physical or cognitive disabilities, or who require end-of-life care
- provide essential and important daily living support and comfort to patients, clients and residents
- assist with bathing, grooming, dressing, toileting and other personal hygiene activities
- may help patients/residents with feeding, mobility and exercise as needed

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Ideal Candidate Qualifications

Registered Nurse:

- must be registered to practice nursing in Alberta. To register, an individual must complete an approved post-secondary nursing education program and pass the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN).
- apply to the College and Association of Registered Nurses of Alberta (CARNA) for Alberta practice registration

Power Engineer:

- must hold at least the Alberta Boilers Safety Association certification level

Licensed Practical Nurse:

- must hold a valid practice permit from the College of Licensed Practical Nurses of Alberta (CLPNA)
- must have graduated from a recognized post-secondary practical nursing program. These programs typically take about two years to complete.
- applicants must successfully write the Canadian Practical Nurse Registration Examination (CPNRE) and apply to the College of Licensed Practical Nurses

Health Care Aide:

- must complete a recognised health care aide certificate program or equivalent. These programs typically take between four months and one year to complete
